# Housekeeping



## School Playground – after school ends

We are very happy for parents to let their children play on our school playground after they are dismissed from school each day, but must remind parents that all children should be supervised by a responsible adult during this time. There are rules for the use of our school play equipment and please may we ask that you **do not allow your children to climb fences/trees or swing on the school gates.** Thank you for your support.



## No Dogs please!

No dogs (apart from assistance dogs) are allowed on the school premises at any time. Could we also ask parents, not to leave their dogs tied up unattended at the school gates. Thank you.

## Names please!



Could we remind parents again to **clearly label their child's uniform and PE kit** with their child's name please. Also, as the winter months draw near could you ensure that your child has a **pair of indoor shoes** and a **coat** at school at all times please. Many thanks.

We have also been asked by some parents recently to clarify our school rules on hair and jewellery so please see below.

## Jewellery/watches



Children are not allowed to wear jewellery or watches to school without permission from the Executive Headteacher, as such items are easily lost or broken. Children with pierced ears may wear small **studs** or **sleepers**, but they must be able to remove them, **unaided**, for PE. Please provide your child with a small container to keep them safe. The school cannot accept responsibility for any injury, loss or damage caused by wearing them.



### Hair

Hair should be kept clean and tidy and should not be brightly coloured, worn in any extreme style or have an appearance inconsistent, in the Executive Headteacher's opinion, with traditional good standards of uniform. Hair extensions are not permitted and colouring is only allowed if it appears natural. No patterns or tramlines should be shaved into the hair or eyebrows. Long hair should be fastened back clear of the face at all times and must be in a plait or ponytail during PE, for reasons of safety. It is helpful if your child keeps a spare hair 'bobble' in their PE bag.



### Pupil Absence

If your child is absent from school, please contact the School Office **before 9.30am** on the morning of their absence. A message will then be relayed to their Class Teacher. All absences should be followed by a letter upon your child's return to school. If no contact has been made by 10.30am, the School has a duty of care to check on your child's welfare, and the School Office will contact you to enquire why your child is absent from School. A reminder as well to complete the leave of absence request form for any planned absence including holiday requests. I can only grant permission for holidays in exceptional circumstances.

### School Day

A gentle reminder that the school day begins at 9.00am. The doors will open from 8.50am each day and the school gates will be locked by 9.05am to enable the school day to begin
