
The authors will write recounts, non-chronological reports and diary entries inspired by the Great Fire. They will be identifying features of information texts and apply them. They will be proof reading and editing their writing for spelling, punctuation and grammar. They will be enjoying Fantastic Mr Fox as our class text.

The historians will use a range of information sources to find out about the past. They will ask and answer questions about the past. The children will then use their knowledge to communicate the information in a variety of ways. The context is the Great Fire of London, which they will explore the what? why? when? who? how? They will explore the key people and events during the event. They will look at the impact of the fire.

Computing- They will learn about online safety with logging in saving and look at the use of technology outside the classroom.

Science- The scientists will be learning about animals. They will sort animals into groups, order life cycles and name animals and their young.

Incarnation
The children will learn why Christmas matters to Christians.
PSHE-
The citizens will explore healthy lifestyles through diets, exercise and hygiene.



Year 1
The mathematicians will consolidate their understanding of place value with numbers up to 100 as well as adding and subtracting. They will also explore measures through length, height, weight and volume.

Year 2
The mathematicians will be learning all about division and how this links to multiplication. They will also study 2D and 3D shapes, explore fractions and look at statistics (graphs and tables). They will finish the spring term looking at measures.

The Arts
The artists will look at the buildings from 1666. They will use charcoal to create St Paul's Cathedral. They will also be making and evaluating bread.

The musicians will start a new music resource called Charanga. The theme this term is 'I wanna play in a band'. They will listen and perform rock music.
